Abstract: The Frederick F. Lenneper Papers document a portion of the artist's life from 1946

to 1980. Record types include: letters, ephemera, newspaper clippings, sketches,

notes, and photographs.

Language: The records are in English.

Biographical Information

Frederick F. Lenneper was born in New York City in 1909, and lived in the Plainfields for 60 years. He was a local artist who worked mostly in oils, watercolor, drawing, and papier mache. He taught art for many decades from his home studio in Plainfield. He was also an inventor of helpful devices, such a simple contraption to make shoveling snow less strenuous, as well as the process of hair stripping. Frederick served in the Army Air Corps during World War II. His wife, Gertrude Gray Lenneper, passed away in 1980; they had no children.

Mr. Lenneper was a display artist for many years in Tepper's department store, as well as designing windows for other local businesses. Most notably for Tepper's, he designed the large totem pole for their children's department. He created the red lobster that was on the top of the Somerset Fish Market in North Plainfield; the lobster is now on top of the Plainfield Elk's building. He designed the stork for the Watchung Rescue Squad, and his larger-than-life-size Easter bunny

bought smiles to the faces of many children who were recuperating at Muhlenberg Hospital during the 1950s, 60s and 70s.

He was a generous and kind man, who donated his time, money, and artwork to many local organizations. He was admired and well-loved by his students, neighbors, and the community at large. He passed away on January 10, 1990 at the Margaret McCutchen Nursing Home in North Plainfield; he was 79 years old.

Scope and Contents

The personal papers of Frederick Lenneper include a variety of material dating from 1946 to 1980, with bulk dates of 1952 to 1967. The collection documents his teaching and artistic work while he resided in the Plainfield area.

Record types include: letters, ephemera, newspaper clippings, sketches, notes, photographs, and negatives. Most of the black and white photographs are of Mr. Lenneper's artwork, both finished pieces and works-in-progress. There is an unframed, circa 1940s portrait photograph of Mr. Lenneper in his Army Air Corps uniform. In addition, there is a negative of a plant sculpture, likely given to Mr. Lenneper by a Plainfield club member, such as the Garden Club.

Arrangement

The material that makes up the Frederick F. Lenneper Papers was originally kept in a scrapbook. Items were attached to the pages by metal paper clips, which were removed. All items were rehoused in archival folders.

The collection is arranged into two series; Series 1 is further divided into three subseries:

Subseries B: Ephemera (including award certificates, event programs, membership cards, one b&w negative, and a portrait of Mr. Lenneper in uniform), circa 1940s, 1957-1972, undated.

Subseries C: Newspaper clippings documenting classes, lectures, and artistic work by Mr. Lenneper, 1946-1974, undated.

Arrangement

Series 1 is arranged by subseries; chronologically within each folder. This series fills three file folders.

Series 2: Artwork [1964-1972, undated]

Series Description

Series 2 contains photographs, negatives, and sketches of Mr. Lenneper's artwork, both finished sculptural pieces and works in progress. This material was removed from the scrapbook pages, kept in order by page, and rehoused in 30 archival folders that fill one oversize box.

The Frederick F. Lenneper Papers are available for research.

Access is restricted to materials prepared by the Local History department staff.
